LEGALIZATION OF MARIJUANA

On November 3rd, voters will go to the polls and determine whether or not marijuana will be legalized for medicinal and recreational use in the State of Ohio. The proposed Marijuana Legalization Amendment (Issue 3), if passed, would control the licensing, regulation, manufacturing and taxation of marijuana, as well as laws governing possession. A competing measure, Issue 2, will also appear on the ballot. If Issue 2 passes, it would invalidate any initiatives that voters approve on the November 3rd ballot that establish economic monopolies. Specifically, it would invalidate the <u>Marijuana Legalization Initiative</u> which limits the number of "grow sites" for marijuana to 10 statewide

ATTENTION: 2014 Returns with Extension for Village of Fairfax are Due 10-31-15

All extended Returns are due Oct. 31, 2015

If you use a tax preparer, please verify that your Fairfax return was/will be filed on time. Late filing fees apply to extended Returns after 10-31-15. Interest applies from 4-15-15.

We will prepare your Fairfax Return free of charge. Individuals need to bring all 2014 W-2's, 1099 Misc. forms and/or other income statements to our Tax Office. If you were self- employed or had rental income during 2014, bring your completed Federal Schedule C or E. *If you misplaced your 2014 W-2's, etc. contact your employer or tax preparer to get new copies. "Businesses need to attach a copy of their Federal Return."

HOURS: 8:30AM to 5:00PM (lunch 12:00 – 1:30) 5:00 – 6:00 & Sat. by appointment Don't forget the drop box by the side door for after-hours payments and papers.

ALL RESIDENTS 18 YEARS OR OLDER MUST FILE a tax return with the Village of Fairfax. even if no tax is due. This includes those who rent. Taxes are based on an individual's earned income. Owners of rental property must also file a return.

OBTAINING FORMS: 1) Tax forms and instructions are available from our Website, www.fairfaxoh.org 2) Forms are also available in the lobby of the Municipal Building 9:00AM - 5:00 PM Monday - Friday. 3) In January of each year tax forms are mailed to registered residents and businesses in the Village. Not receiving a form does not excuse anyone from filing a tax return. *To Register, as a new resident or if you moved since filing your last tax return, call the tax office 527-6506 or submit the form on our website.

Received a notice that the 2014 Tax Return you filed was incomplete? You need to reply promptly. Any incomplete Tax Return is considered "unfiled". After 30 days of the 1st notice is also subject to late filing fees and possible legal action.

If you receive a correction notice stating additional tax due, you must submit tax due and "signed copy of the corrected 2014 Tax Return" by the due date in your notice.

POLICY FOR LATE FILING FEE and LATE PAYMENT OF TAX

- 1) Late filing fee of \$15.00 to \$30.00 charged even if no tax is due.
- 2) Past due Tax, penalty 1% per month and/or interest 1% per month on balance due.
- 3) 1st time filers are exempt from late filing fee, but still pay penalty and interest. (However, if a taxpayer does not respond to our letters, they still can be subject to late filing fee, penalty and/or interest, and possible legal action.)
