Next year, Duke Energy Ohio will begin work to rebuild electric facilities along Murray Road in Fairfax; Hiawatha, Wooster Pike in Mariemont and Round Bottom and Broadwell Roads in Newtown and Anderson. Construction associated with the rebuilding of electric facilities will occur within existing easements and/or road right of way.

Although construction for this project will not begin until 2016, preliminary work will begin in the near future. As a result, you may notice surveying vendors in your neighborhood, locating facilities and underground utilities. You may also see the local Underground Protection Service (Call Before You Dig) marking utilities within this area. For your safety as well as others, please be aware of this work in your neighborhood and observe all posted construction signs.

Cincinnati Sports Mall to Add Second Indoor Pool

As part of its Club Vision 2025 Master Plan, The Cincinnati Sports Club has filed construction permits with the Village of Fairfax to install a second indoor pool. Construction began in July, and the pool will be located in the club’s former Group Exercise Studio located across from the squash and racquetball courts. Expected completion date is Spring 2016.

“The pool is part of an ongoing and conscious effort to continually provide members with a broader selection of various lifestyle amenities and activities, and is a critical component of our long-term Vision 2025 Master Plan,” says Club Manager Julie Goodchild.

Keeping member feedback top of mind, the existing 25 yard indoor pool will become a dedicated “lap swimming” pool which will be available during the club’s normal operating hours. The pool temperature will also be lowered by a few degrees to accommodate the lap swimmers.

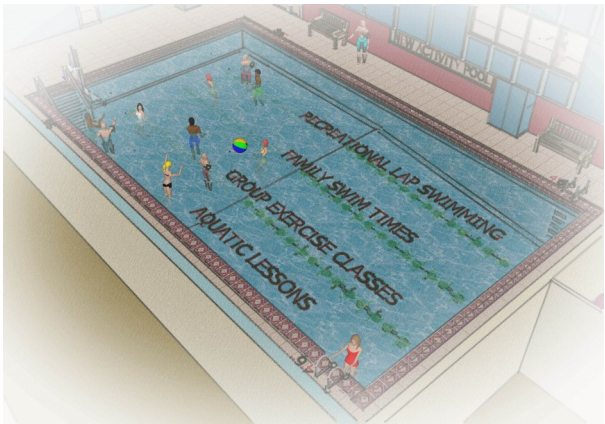
The new second indoor pool will be used as an “activity” pool, and will accommodate an additional number of group water classes, family swim, recreational swimming, swim lessons and also water therapy conducted by both Cincinnati Sports Club personal trainers and physical therapists from the Christ Hospital. The pool will feature a saline filtration system, and will be 20 yards long with a gradual depth slope of three feet six inches to four feet eight inches.

“The pool will impact our members by providing both new and expanded group programming, more ‘family swims’ on a year-round basis and also additional times for swim lessons to better accommodate the kids’ school schedules.” said Goodchild.

The Club converted the current indoor pool from a chlorine filtration system to a saline system in 2012, to be “more gentle on the eyes and skin” than chlorine pools. Once construction of the new indoor pool is complete, the 16-acre facility will feature four aquatics pools, a whirlpool and a splash pad.

Goodchild concludes, “It’s important to us that we provide the best, most convenient facilities and programs for our members. They can now count on the fact that no matter when they come to the Club, they will soon be able to use the aquatic facilities for their specific workout needs and family activities whenever they like.”

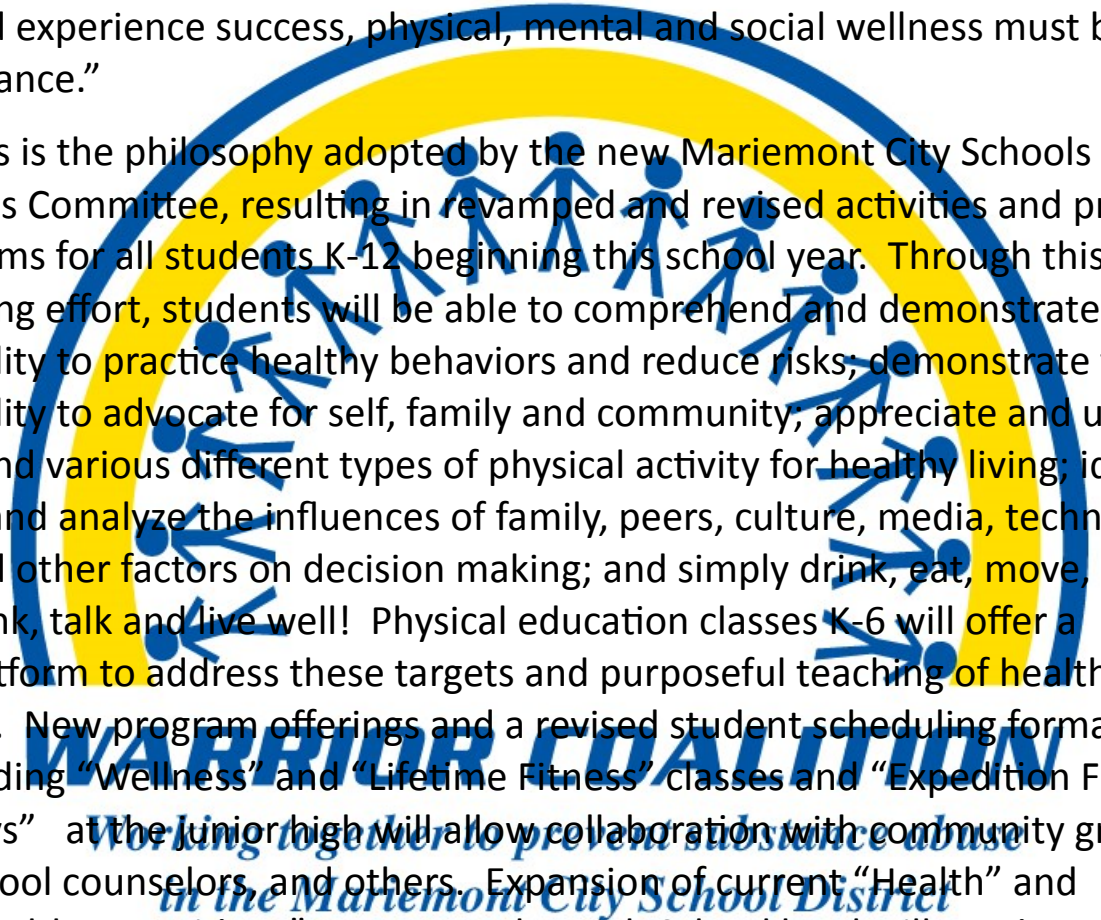

Mariemont City Schools Updates Wellness Curriculum

“Wellness, in all aspects, is an essential component of learning and student success. In order to ensure our students are best prepared to learn and experience success, physical, mental and social wellness must be in balance.”

This is the philosophy adopted by the new Mariemont City Schools Wellness Committee, resulting in revamped and revised activities and programs for all students K-12 beginning this school year. Through this ongoing effort, students will be able to comprehend and demonstrate the ability to practice healthy behaviors and reduce risks; demonstrate the ability to advocate for self, family and community; appreciate and understand various different types of physical activity for healthy living; identify and analyze the influences of family, peers, culture, media, technology and other factors on decision making; and simply drink, eat, move, sleep, think, talk and live well! Physical education classes K-6 will offer a platform to address these targets and purposeful teaching of healthy living. New program offerings and a revised student scheduling format, including “Wellness” and “Lifetime Fitness” classes and “Expedition Fridays” at the Junior high will allow collaboration with community groups, school counselors, and others. Expansion of current “Health” and “Healthy Transitions” courses at the High School level will continue to afford students the ability to benefit from numerous and various seminars, classroom guest speakers, and community programs concentrated in areas of personal wellness and health related career paths.
