GAS METER INSPECTIONS **COMING**

Beginning in February and through May of this year. Duke Energy will be performing inspections on gas metering equipment and piping located inside buildings in this area. The inspections will involve the gas piping from the building wall to the outlet of the gas meter to check for leakage and corrosion. On average, an inspection should take approximately ten minutes to complete.

Duke Energy has contacted with Southern Cross, Inc. to complete these inspections at residents and businesses with inside gas meters. The Southern Cross technician will be readily identifiable by wearing a visible Southern Cross ID picture ID as well as having a contact number for the customer to call for verification of the Duke Energy Ohio inspection. They will be driving a Southern Cross vehicle.

On April 10th, Mariemont High School's Key Club is hosting their third annual Eliminate 5k at MHS Kusel Stadium. In partnership with Kiwanis International and UNICEF, this student-led race raises money for the Eliminate Project, which vaccinates mothers in third world countries to prevent maternal and neonatal tetanus.

Over the past two years, MHS Key Club has raised over \$21,000 for the Eliminate Project, saving over 11,000 families from maternal and neonatal tetanus. Tax Season Reminders

2015 Village of Fairfax Tax Returns are due April 18, 2016

All residents 18 years of age or older must file a tax return with the Village of Fairfax. This includes those who rent. Late filing charge applies even if no tax is due.

Due date changed to comply with federal due date.

Taxes are based on an individual's earned income. You must submit W-2's, 1099Misc. forms, Schedule E, Schedule C, and other income statements (interest, dividends and retirement income are NOT taxed by Fairfax). More details on how to calculate the tax due and fill out your Return will be in the April Forum or call the Tax Office for a copy of the February 2016 tax article 513-527-6506.

IMPORTANT: 2015 Returns were mailed as of 12-31-15 "only estimated tax paid by 12-31-15" will show on your return. Any payments you made after 12-31-15 need to be added to your credits on line 5b when you calculate your return.

Tax Returns also are on our website, <u>www.fairfaxohio.org</u> or available in the lobby of our Municipal Building. The lobby is open Mon. – Fri., 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. <u>Not receiving a tax form does not excuse anyone from filing a Tax Return.</u>

If you file a federal extension, you must "also file an extension with the Village of Fairfax". Any tax estimated to be due for 2015 must be paid with your extension to avoid penalty and/or interest charges. Remember extensions are only for filing your return, and do not extend the time in which to pay tax due.

"NEW RESIDENTS" and THOSE WHO MOVED SINCE FILING THEIR TAX RETURN MUST REGISTER. Please call the Tax Office at 527-6506 promptly.

Tax Tips: 1) File early to avoid late filing fees.

- 2) Make an estimated tax payment now to avoid owing a large amount on April 18. (Estimated tax is based on the prior year's tax.)

 *REMEMBER TO ADD ANY ESTIMATED TAX PAID AFTER 12-31-15

 TO THE CREDIT ON LINE 5b OF YOUR 2015 TAX RETURN.
- 3) <u>Husband and wife can file a joint return for Fairfax</u> regardless of how they file their State and Federal Returns.
- 4) <u>Check your pay stub for local tax paid.</u> You should only pay local tax to the place where you work or live. (If you find an error, contact your company's payroll department immediately.)
