FROM THE MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT

NEW POLICY FOR LARGE LOAD BRUSH PICK-UP: Fairfax must make a change in our program where residents can request a truck be dropped off at their home so that larger amounts of brush can be loaded by the resident and then hauled away by the Maintenance Department. A fee of \$15 will now be charged to remove a truckload of brush, due to that cost now being charged to the Village. A resident must come to the municipal building and make payment ahead of time. Once payment is made, a resident may contact the Village Maintenance Department at 527-6508 to arrange for the truck to be dropped off.

Residents may still place smaller amounts of brush, tied in twine, and cut into 4 foot lengths on the curb for free pick up. Small branch, twig and brush pick up at the curb occurs every Monday morning.

The Village will provide the FREE service of delivering bulk mulch, gravel or limestone to residents if they make arrangements and payment with Hafner & Sons or Evans Landscaping ahead of time. We can also pick up larger trees at a nursery and have it delivered to your home. Again, contact 527-6508 for more information or to make this arrangement.

A general reminder for the winter months: turn off the valve for any outside water faucets. Remove your hose from the hose bib to prevent any remaining water in the hose from freezing around the bib.

Robbie Curran, Gabe Hartnett, Bennett Turan, and Griffen Wilner's Eagle Projects Create Lasting Legacies

Over the past several months, four Scouts from Mariemont's Troop 149 have completed Eagle projects that will help to benefit their communities for years to come.

Robbie Curran, a 2018 Mariemont High School graduate, built a handrail and added landscaping to the baseball field at Mariemont Junior High. He finished his project in March. He deferred his diploma and is currently participating in work study and life skills programs through Mariemont High School. Robbie was the team manager for the junior varsity and varsity high school baseball teams, and wanted to contribute something to the team's home field as well as the community he lives in.

Bennett Turan built an outdoor classroom for 24 students at Mariemont Junior High in May. The classroom features one ton of landscaping flagstone, benches, boxwood plants and a teacher's podium built of composite materials. Bennett is an honors

> is on the school's soccer, cross country and track teams. He is also a member of the Order of the Arrow, the National Honor Society of the Boy Scouts of America.

Griffen Wilner made significant improvements to a path used by Mariemont Junior High students in October, removing overgrown vegetation, painting guardrails, installing safety posts and laying more than three tons of limestone gravel to make the path safer and more inviting. Griffen is an honors 9th grader at Mariemont High School and joins his older brother Lucas as an Eagle Scout. He is on the school's cross country, track and swim teams.

Gabe Hartnett constructed a 30-foot flagpole and planted landscaping at Mariemont's Dogwood Park. Located at the foot of Mariemont's iconic Bell Tower, the flagpole will serve as both a landmark and feature for events like the village's Fourth of July celebration and summer bell tower concerts. Gabe is an honors senior at Mariemont High School, where he is a member of the swim team. He loves to snowboard and rows for Cincinnati Junior Rowing Club.



Like all of Troop 149's Eagle Scouts, they had significant help from their fellow Scouts in the construction of their projects and are grateful for the support.



All of these scouts were members of Pack 1 here in Fairfax and earned their Arrow of Light with Pack 1 before joining Troop 149.
