Building Dept. Changes

The Village now contracts with the Hamilton County Building Department and no longer issues permits in-house with the retirement of Building Official John Hester in December 2018. Residential and commercial properties, are however, required to obtain a Zoning Certificate from the Village of Fairfax for most projects BEFORE submitting a permit application to Hamilton County

For all new projects including new construction, additions, roofs, HVAC, building alterations, demolitions, construction of decks, etc. a zoning application must be filled out and submitted to Mr. Telgkamp. The zoning application is available online at www.fairfaxoh.com or a form can be picked up from the municipal building or requested from the Zoning Official at dtelgkamp@fairfaxoh.org.

Once a zoning certificate is issued, to apply for a building permit, go to

www.hamitoncounty.gov/government/departments/buidlings and inspections. There you can download permit applications, schedule an inspection or contact the Building Department for building code related questions. All building permit fees are now payable to Hamilton County before the issuance of a permit.

There are some items that do not require a building permit, but just need zoning approval. Examples are fences and sheds of a certain size. The Zoning Official can inform you of what items need just zoning approval and which require both zoning approval and a building permit from Hamilton County.

Solicitation Permits: Anyone going door to door in the Village must register with the Police Department. If you are unsure about anyone coming to your door, please contact the police department at 271-7250.

Communicator: All residents and businesses can be added to the automated communicator system for emergency notifications and community announcements. Please contact the police department at 271-7250 to register.

Recycling: Because What We Do Matters....

Thank you, Fairfax! The majority of our neighbors are recycling! Now we need to make sure we recycle the right items.



What is wrong with this recycling cart? A few items in this cart are not accepted for

First, we should not bag any recyclable items. Leave recyclables loose within the recycling cart. Plastic bags that end up at the recycling center get caught in machinery, become a hazard for workers, and cause shutdowns at the recycling center for safe removal. Please bring your plastic bags back to your local retailer for recycling.

Second, not all plastic is recyclable in your cart. This cart has various plastic containers (egg cartons, 6-pack rings, plastic bags, and salad containers) that are not recyclable. The only plastic materials acceptable for recycling in Hamilton County are bottles and jugs. Other plastics should go into the garbage

This spring, the Village of Fairfax and the Hamilton County Recycling and Solid Waste District are working together to improve our recycling. In May, residents will receive two postcards reminding them of what they can put in their recycling cart. The acceptable items for Hamilton County include:

- Bottles and Jugs
- Metal Cana
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Paper and Cardboard
